

This year has been a testament to the power of community and our shared commitment to making lowa shine. Keep lowa Beautiful (KIB) continues to enhance the image and vitality of our countryside, towns, and cities—improving economic health and cultural pride across the state. From revitalizing sheep barns to creating murals to building accessible sidewalks, restoring historic landmarks, and supporting new wellness centers and playgrounds, our work strengthens communities. Thanks to your support, we are expanding programs that foster engagement and leadership.

The **Hometown Pride** program welcomed nine new communities in northwest Iowa, including Albert City, Alta, Aurelia, Lake Park, Lakeside, Marathon, Royal, Sioux Rapids, and Storm Lake. With the addition of a new coach, more residents are becoming strong local leaders, ensuring lasting improvements in their towns.

We are proud of KIB's **Paint Iowa Beautiful** initiative, a longstanding partnership with Diamond Vogel Paint of Orange City. Thousands of gallons of paint have been donated. As a result, millions of square feet have been painted, reflecting the pride we all share in our communities.

Through **Pick-Up Iowa**, volunteers dedicated their time collecting bags of litter—keeping our roads, parks, and waterways clean. We honored our **2024 annual award recipients and scholarship winners** at the Iowa Capitol with Governor Reynolds and Lt. Governor Gregg, recognizing outstanding contributions to our mission.

Our **Third Annual Golf Tournament** exceeded expectations with record turnout and raised \$50,000 for key programs, thanks to generous donors and volunteers.

Additionally, we stood in awe at the photos submitted for Keep Iowa Beautiful's **Annual Photography Contest**, which showcases Iowa's rural and urban beauty.

We are deeply grateful to our board leadership for their dedication and service. Rural small towns are the backbone of Iowa, and Keep Iowa Beautiful is committed to revitalizing these communities that we call home.

Keep Iowa Beautiful's programming is built on the pride we feel for our towns and the people in them. All programs are rooted in building community pride in residents of all ages by empowering community volunteers to create cultural and economic improvements to sustain generations to come.

Program Spotlight: Hometown Pride

Created in 2012, Hometown Pride improves communities using a five-year coaching model. Projects created and implemented through Hometown Pride enhance the community while giving residents the skills and resources to better the communities in which they live and work. In partnership with the Iowa Economic Development Authority, the program supports qualifying lowa communities, coaches, and volunteers to create physical, cultural, and economic improvements in their town to increase community pride. Hometown Pride has been implemented in 118 communities in 20 counties, raising more than \$18 million for over 2,200 community betterment projects with the help of more than 3.000 volunteers.



Keep Iowa Beautiful welcomed the addition of nine new towns to the Hometown Pride program in 2024: Albert City, Alta, Aurelia, Lake Park, Lakeside, Marathon, Royal, Sioux Rapids, and Storm Lake. "It's refreshing to see these communities ready to jump in. Each one has many unique and exciting things happening, and I'm grateful to have the opportunity to help them take their betterment efforts even further," said Coach Carissa Harvey.







HEAR IT FROM A HOMETOWN PRIDE COMMUNITY

Delmar – A Catalyst for Economic Renewal (population 542 / Clinton County)

When Delmar joined Hometown Pride, no new businesses or amenities had been added to the community in 20 years. Community leaders were motivated to make a change, but unsure of how to address their challenges.

Delmar Hometown Pride started off with a bang, raising more than \$100,000 to build a long-awaited community amenity: a splash pad.

Their speedy success served as an immediate catalyst for economic renewal in Delmar. After seeing what the community could achieve when they came together, local entrepreneurs and builders gained confidence in the town, and over the next few years Delmar saw 5 new businesses, several new homes and a total of \$2 million in construction projects. Delmar Hometown Pride went on to lead renovations of the historic rail depot, restoration of a historic mural, construction of a disc golf course and more.

"Hometown Pride's success showed others that people working together could have an impact in the community," shared Francis Boggus, Delmar's Hometown Pride coach. "And that encouraged others to start businesses."

"Hometown Pride has been a wonderful experience in Delmar," says Scott Derby, owner of 2 of the 5 new businesses that opened in Delmar in recent years. He attributes his confidence in establishing new businesses in Delmar to the efforts of Hometown Pride, which made him feel "immediately a part of a community who cares about its history and future."

"Hometown Pride has brought pride back into our town again. It taught us to think big. When we brought up the idea of a splash pad, people kind of laughed, but our coach just looked at me and said, 'You guys can do this.'" Looking back on their many accomplishments over the past seven years, she says, "It never would have happened without Hometown Pride." -Cathie Jebsen, Delmar Hometown Pride Volunteer

Partnership Spotlights

Derelict Building Grant

Keep Iowa Beautiful, in partnership with the Iowa Department of Natural Resources, pioneered the Derelict Building Program, which provides financial assistance to Iowa communities with populations of 5,000 or fewer. The program, now run by the Iowa DNR, helps address neglected structures that have been vacant for at least six months, focusing on landfill diversion by promoting the recycling and reuse of building materials.

Build With Bags

The Build with Bags program, led by the Iowa Grocery Industry Association, awards grants to help communities purchase picnic tables, park benches, planters, and playground equipment made from recycled plastic bags. Each park bench repurposes approximately 10,600 plastic bags, while a single picnic table is made from more than 20,000 plastic bags, supporting both sustainability and community enhancement. The Build with Bags program is a cooperative effort of the Iowa Grocery Industry Association, Keep Iowa Beautiful, the Iowa Department of Natural Resources, Metro Waste Authority and Plastic Recycling of Iowa Falls.

2024 Iowa Recycles Day Proclamation and Keep Iowa Beautiful Month Proclamation

On April 15, 2024, Governor Kim Reynolds proclaimed April as Keep Iowa Beautiful Month, reinforcing the state's commitment to vibrant, thriving communities. In November, she designated November 15th as Iowa Recycles Day, recognizing efforts to promote sustainability. These proclamations highlight the impact of individual actions in keeping Iowa clean and beautiful. WHEREAS, the Iowa Recycling Association advances effective recycling by sharing resources, education and advocacy opportunities, and its members serve communities across the state, embracing national best practices, and continuously striving to adopt cutting-edge technology for the benefit of Iowans and our environment; and

WHEREAS, Iowa is a national leader in implementing innovative policies across industries to ensure a cleaner, greener state for future generations; and

WHEREAS, strongly advocating for recycling, reuse and waste reduction is essential to those efforts; and WHEREAS, Keep Iowa Beautiful and its partner, the Iowa Recycling Association, recognize the importance of promoting recycling statewide through observance of America Recycles Day on November 15, 2024, and on this day we renew our commitment to making environmentally conscious changes in our lives so that our children and grandchildren can live that better, cleaner future. Let us continue in striving to reduce waste, conserve resources, and meet our obligations to our planet and to future generations.
