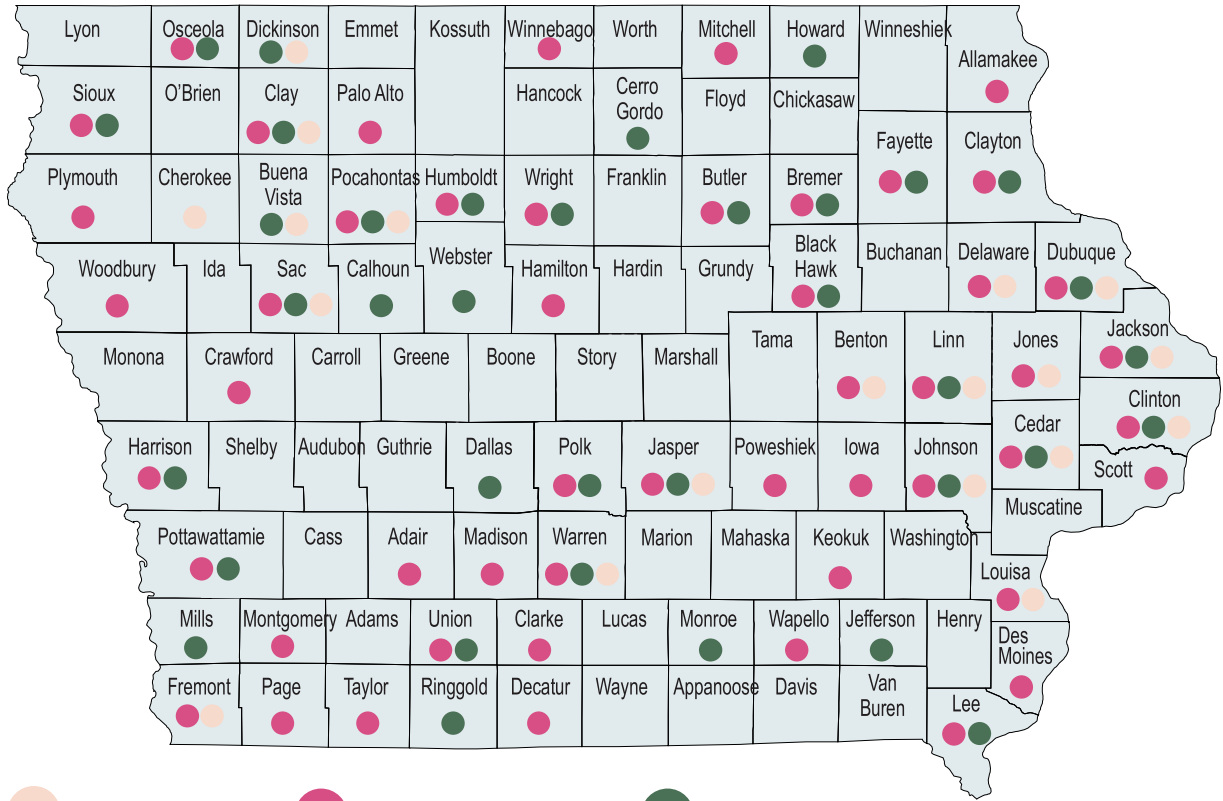

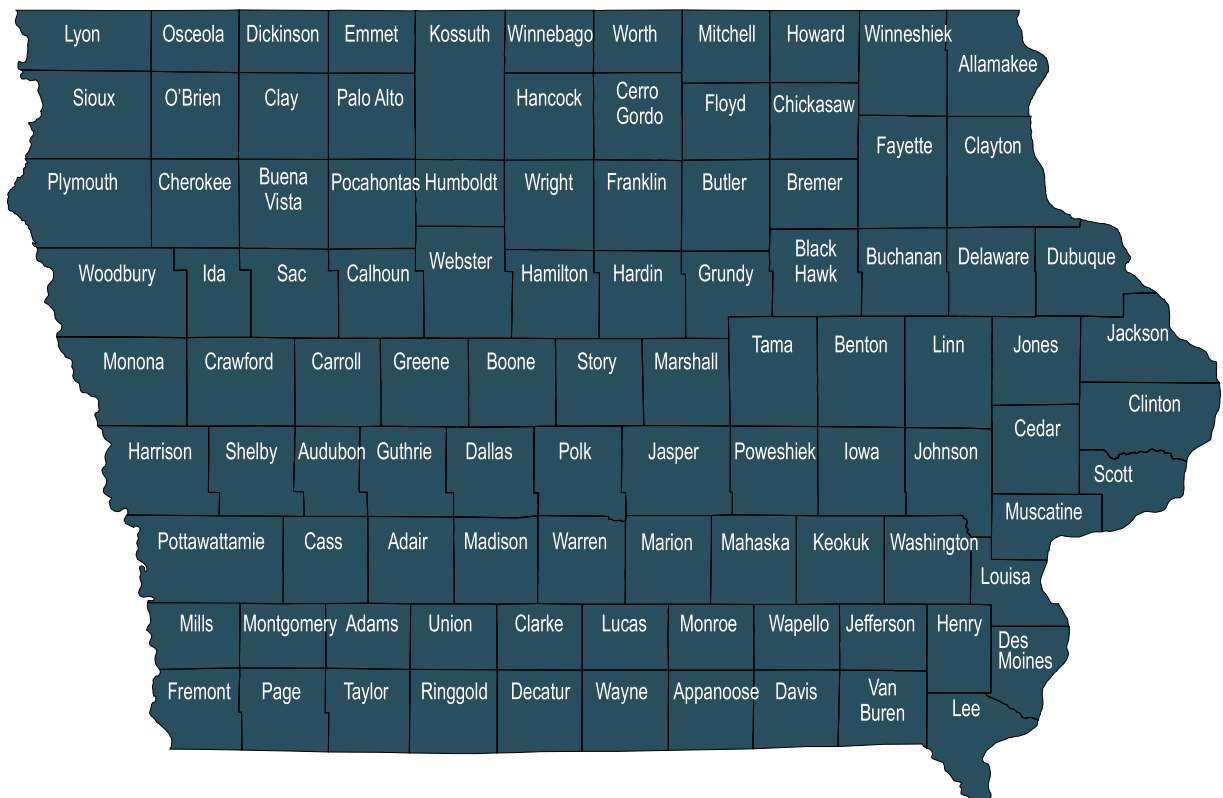

Keep Iowa Beautiful empowers Iowans to create vibrant communities and build hometown pride through volunteer-driven enhancement programs.



Hills' Songbird Sanctuary Park

Hills Hometown Pride celebrated two major additions to their downtown this year, with the opening of “Songbird Sanctuary Park” and completion of a large mural depicting the life and history of Hills. “Hometown Pride has been a great thing for our community,” shared City administrator Adriane Sedlacek.

Sedlacek is enthusiastic about the way that Hometown Pride has brought together residents to make things happen since they joined in 2022. “It’s not just ‘ what is the city going to do next’ but ‘what are we going to do together? What do we have up our sleeve next?’”

The Success of Holy Cross

“The Holy Cross committee is an incredibly energetic, collaborative and cohesive team,” shares Hometown Pride coach Tricia Wagner. “When they decide to do something, they get it done in the blink of an eye.” In 2025 alone, their committee led the completion of a new set of pickleball courts in the park, a “field of dreams” community mural, a city-wide holiday light tour, a side-by-side scavenger hunt fundraiser, an easter egg hunt and a regional training on the economic benefits of trails. Their success is fueled both by support from the community and a positive group of volunteers who work well together. “When they meet, it’s like a well-oiled machine” says Wagner. “They finish each other’s thoughts, have honest discussions, respect everyone’s opinions and come to a consensus.”

Lake View Community Center

The Lake View Hometown Pride committee and the community of Lake View celebrated the opening of the \$2.4 million Lake View Community Center. Since the

grand opening in May the center has been embraced by the community and operating profitably. Local Hometown Pride leader Brent Mueggenberg says that the committee

has been working toward this goal since 2019 and notes that this is “one of the largest community betterment projects undertaken by our town.” He attributed the success to “a great pool of dedicated volunteers” with a wide variety of talents.

Lake Park Hometown Pride took off running in their first year! Since kicking off in early 2025, the committee has raised \$1.6 million through grants and donations for the Silver Lake City Park Project, in partnership with the City of Lake Park. The group also hosted a “Farm to Fork” community dinner (pictured) and a Harvest festival.

Input from the Community

Hometown Pride values the expertise and insight of the residents in the towns it serves! Our new Hometown Pride committees in northwest Iowa distributed public surveys to their fellow residents to better understand opinions on the community and identify projects to work on in the coming years. More than 700 responses were received across 8 towns. Committees also held open houses and set up informational booths at local events.



Beautifying the Luxemburg City Park

Keep Luxemburg Beautiful (a Hometown Pride committee) and the City of Luxemburg celebrated the completion of a long-awaited project: a newly paved walking trail at Luxemburg City Park. Volunteers in Luxemburg also brought new amenities to the park, such as an information board and dog clean-up station, and held numerous fundraisers, including a bowling tournament, a community scavenger hunt, music in the park and more.

Park Improvements

Paint Iowa Beautiful provides grant recipients free paint to support a wide variety of public service and community betterment projects, from restoring park shelters and historic landmarks to brightening main street facades and public murals.

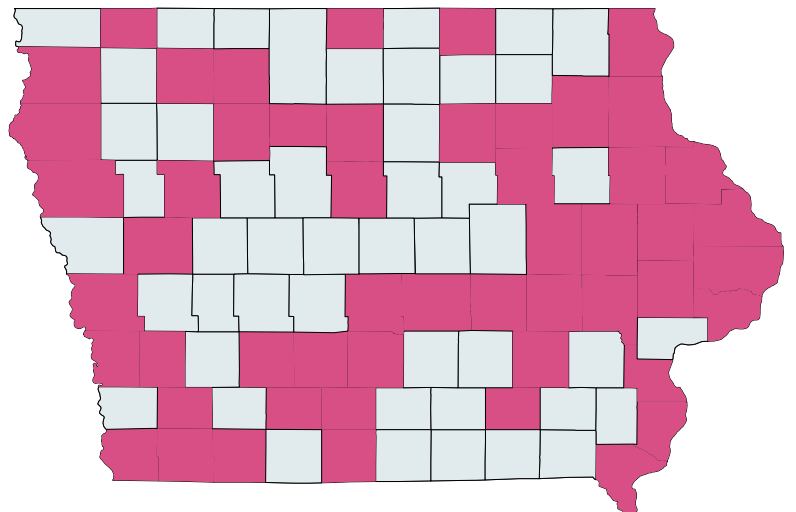

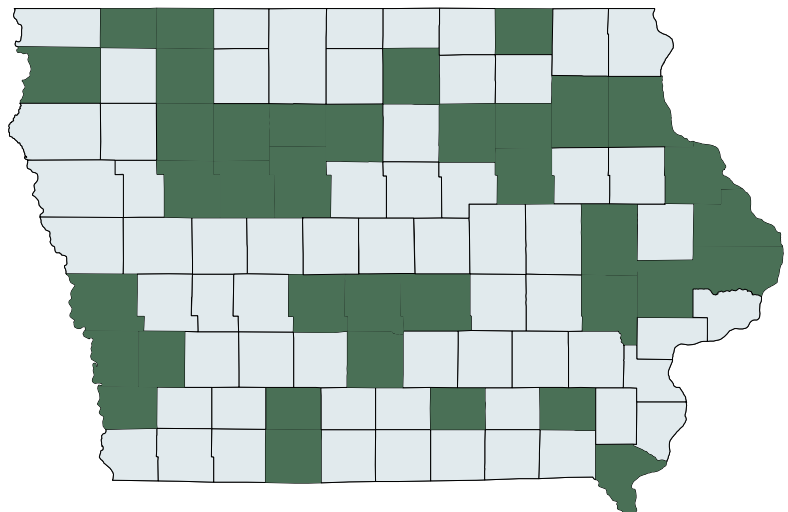
